LYDIA JOHNSON DANCE. Ms. Johnson's choreographic voice is an individual one that often makes poetic art of movement that might otherwise be described as somewhat gawky, in dances with a distinctive simplicity and eloquent abstraction. Music -- from Steve Reich and rock to Beethoven and Hindemith -- is a frequent inspiration and one feature of this New Jersey-based company's program of new and recent works is Ms. Johnson's collaboration with Steven Masi, a concert pianist who will perform here.
